CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All competitors must **pay for entry** into the grounds. Ground Entry tickets may be requested at time of nomination.
2. The Samford Show Society Inc will not accept any **responsibility** for any mishaps to competitors, horses, equipment or onlookers which may occur. **Competitors only in the main ring.**
3. The Show Society strongly recommends handlers, competitors, judges and stewards wear appropriate footwear, clothing and headgear.
4. The Chief-Steward will control participants as he/she sees fit. His/Her orders must be obeyed with out question.
5. By lodging your nomination on the day you accept the rules, bylaws and regulations of the Show Society.
6. **Entries** are \$4.00 per class. **Prize money:** First \$10.00, second \$6.00 and third \$3.00 unless otherwise stated. In classes where there **are 2 competitors or less** the Show Society reserves the right to pay \$6.00 for first and \$3 for second place.
7. Prize money can be collected at the nominations hut after 10am.
8. All competitors must be ready to commence their classes at the stipulated time and/or at the conclusion of the final call from the announcer.
9. Classes **will not** be held up for competitors competing in other rings.
10. **Entries** are to be made on the day. All entries must be made before entering the class. Entry tickets must be completed in full.
11. There will be **no refunds** made on unused entry tickets.
12. **Judges decisions are final.**
13. All **protests** must be made in writing and lodged with the ring master within 30 minutes of the judge's award being made. A deposit of \$60.00 is required to lodge a protest. Should the Protest Committee consider the protest as frivolous, the deposit shall be forfeited.
14. The Ringmaster is empowered to alter or cancel any event or change the sequence of events at their discretion.
15. **Local** signifies residence within the Pine Rivers Shire. Residency by owner and horse must be continuous for three months prior to the show.
16. **Local events** are considered restricted events; awards won do not affect eligibility for the rest of the show.
17. The **age** of the horse shall be calculated from the first day of August.
18. A **maiden** is a horse that has not won a first prize in a hack class at an agricultural or hack show. (Local classes exempt)
19. A **novice** is a horse that has not won an open championship at an agricultural or hack show. (Local classes exempt)
20. No **stallions** are permitted in hack classes other than those stated in the program.
19. **Pony hacks** must be ridden by a rider under 18 years except where stated otherwise.
20. A pony is under 14 hands.
21. A **Galloway** is 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands.
22. An **Amateur class** is open to people who do not derive their income from the training, selling, instructing or showing of horses.
23. Current EFA, Hack Council and Show Horse measurement cards will be accepted as proof of height.

24. The **hunter hack classes** have been created for the horse/Galloway/pony which demonstrates a bit more substance than which is generally seen in an open hack class but is expected to demonstrate the ability to provide a smooth, even ride and reliable temperament. The Show Hunter should exhibit sound confirmation, be free from hereditary defects and unsoundness. It should demonstrate that it is sound in wind and limb but as it is expected to carry its rider across country over a variety of terrain and obstacles, an honourable bump or lump can be overlooked. **The Show Hunters compete on the flat only and do not need to prove they can jump, however, working hunter classes require the horses to jump.** The work-out should be similar to that expected in an open hack class but should include a hand gallop and a change of lead at the canter. It must cover the ground in all paces, with the hand gallop being well balanced and moving from the shoulders, with the hind legs under. A flat and stilted action is unacceptable. Manners are extremely important and all misdemeanors should be penalized. Saddlery should be clean, neat and well fitting but may be more workmanlike than normal for an open hack class. 25. **For all Hunter Classes** the head Gear worn should be in accordance with E.F.A. Regulations and must have the appropriate chin strap.
 - All Classes to be ridden in an English Style Saddle, Bridles are to have plain brow bands and no coloured ribbons are to be worn in hair.
 - Junior Riders are **not** permitted to wear top boots. (Junior Rider 17 years and under)
 - Competitors will be asked to gallop – either individually or as a group.
 - It is recommended that the horse and rider have had previous jumping experience prior to entering the **working hunter classes.**
26. **Show hunters may compete in novice hack classes but are ineligible to compete in open saddle hack / galloway / pony classes.**
27. **ALL HORSES MUST BE REGISTERED WITH A RECOGNISED STUD BOOK OF THE BREED** for breed events. Registration papers must be produced on request.
28. **Pony Club events:** Nomination fee will be \$10.00 per rider and no prize money is paid. Trophies will be awarded to the champion of each age group.
29. Pony Club events will be run in accordance with the PCAQ rules and guidelines.
30. The **horse and rider challenge** events are open to all comers. These events have been established for riders to showcase their horsemanship skills both on the ground and in the saddle. The Beginner class is open to young horse and/ or young rider partnerships who are just establishing a connection. **Intermediate** classes are designed for those competitors who have been working with their horses for a good period of time and are confident to handle a variety of challenging/"spooky" situations. The **Advanced** class is for those partnerships that feel they can demonstrate control and a strong and willing partnership in a demanding environment.
31. Each individual's round may be constrained by a time limit or curtailed at the discretion of the judge.
32. A horse/rider combination can only compete in a maximum of **two** of the horse and rider challenge classes.
